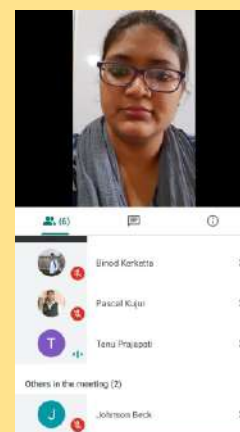
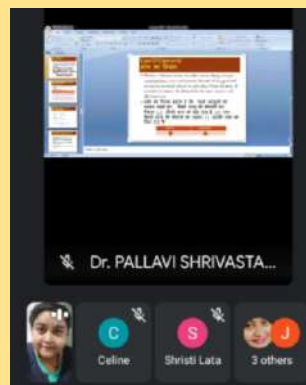

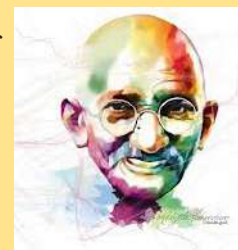
Commencement of the New Academic Year 2020-2021

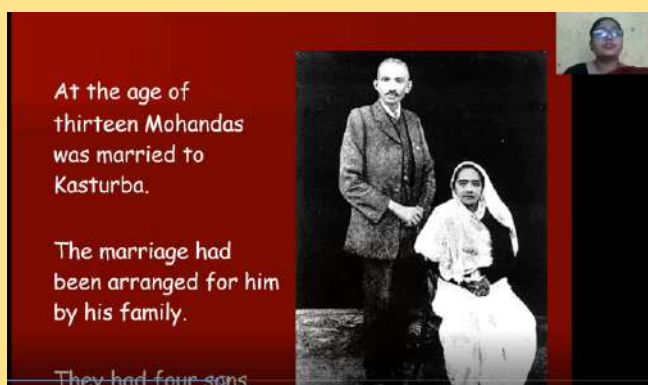
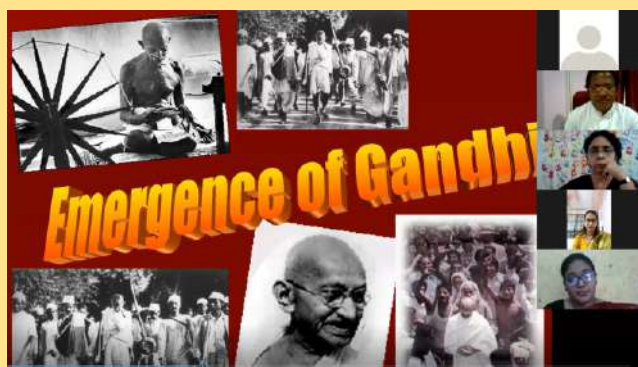


Celebrations on Gandhi Jayanti

Folk Dance Competition

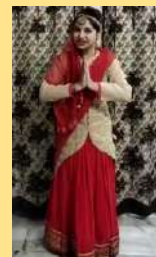

Rev. Fr. Dominic- The Director's Birthday Celebration

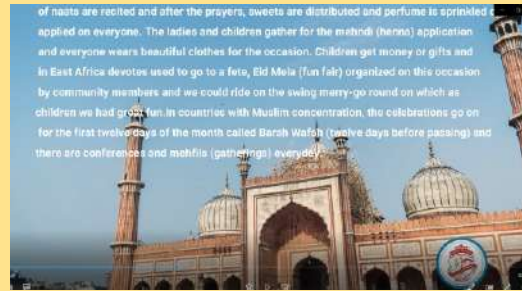
