Important Days in May 2025

The occasion of Maharana Pratap Jayanti honours the illustrious and valiant rule of Chittor's first birthday. He was a legendary warrior, the pride of Rajasthan, and a force to be feared. He was Rana Udai Singh II, the Mewar king,'s son.

11 May -Mother's Day

Mother's Day is celebrated every year on the second Sunday of May to honour motherhood and is observed in different forms throughout the world. Mother's Day was founded by Anna Jarvis who had given the idea of celebrating Mother's Day in honour of mothers and motherhood in 1907. Nationally this day was recognised in 1914.

12 May - Buddha Jayanti or Bhddha Purnima

It is believed that on the full moon of the month of Vaishakh, Gautama Buddha was born in Lumbini near Kapilavastu. He is also known as 'Jyoti Punj of Asia' or 'Light of Asia'. This year, Buddha Jayanti or Buddha Purnima is celebrated on 12 May.

15 May – International Day of Families

International Day of Families is observed every year on 15 May. Family is the basic unit of society. This day provides an opportunity to raise awareness about the issues related to families and to increase knowledge about the social, economic and demographic processes that affect them.
